(PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES)
EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2019

NOTICE is hereby given that on 5th July 2019 Somerset County Council made an Experimental Order in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 4, 9 and 10, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act.

The effect of this Order is to prohibit the driving of motor vehicles on Wine Street, Yeovil as specified in Schedule 1 to this Notice. The Order shall come into force on 22nd July 2019 and will remain in force for a maximum period of 18 months.

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR PROPOSING TO MAKE THE ORDER

The Council's reasons for proposing to make the above Order are as follows: -

Due to road safety concerns and traffic management issues it is proposed to implement changes, the effect of which is to prohibit the driving of motor vehicles on Wine Street, Yeovil, by introducing an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order. This will enable the Council to monitor the situation to determine whether the measures are effective and also to see what impact the scheme has on traffic in the area.

The Experimental Order has been made to allow for an assessment of the changes before a decision is taken to make it permanent.
