

Somerset County Council
Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 - Section 14(2)
(5 Day Notice)
Various Roads, Minehead
(Temporary Traffic Restrictions) Order 2019

Somerset County Council, in exercise of its powers under section 14(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended and after giving notice to the Chief Officer of Police, has issued a Notice, the effect of which is to introduce a temporary prohibition of vehicles restriction on the length of roads listed in the Schedules below.

This Notice will come into operation on the 29th November 2019 and will remain in force for a maximum of 5 days. If the event cannot be completed during that period the Council may make a temporary Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 Act, to continue in force the provisions of this Notice for a further period. The restrictions will only apply when indicated by traffic signs.
