The County Council of Somerset (Main Road, Wearne) (30mph Speed Limit) Order 2006 will be revoked.

SOMERSET COUNTY COUNCIL in exercise of its powers under Section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as “the Act of 1984”) and of all other enabling powers, and in accordance of Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order shall come into force on the xxth day of xxxxxxx 2019 and may be cited as “Somerset County Council (Wearne Main Road, Langport) (Parish of Huish Episcopi) (Revocation and 30 mph Speed Limit) Order 2019”.
2. The County Council of Somerset (Main Road, Wearne) (30mph Speed Limit) Order 2006 is hereby revoked.
3. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour on the length of road specified in the Schedule 2 to this Order.
4. Vehicles falling within regulation 3(1), 3(2), 3(3) and 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011(a) when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.
